The First Success

LTW had a phenomenal showing at the 2005 SHOT Show where a check, in the amount of \$20,000 from the raffle of the LTW No.1 pistol, was presented to Ted Nugent to benefit his namesake charity, Ted Nugent Kamp for Kids. This go-around, LTW is again donating the product of their labors to Kamp for Kids, but in an effort to top their own legacy the LTW membership has decided to make this raffle even bigger.

The Guns

Action trued, bolt lugs lapped.

- -Stainless steel match barrel with 11degree recessed target crown.
- -Fluted barrel.
- -Trigger tuned to three pounds.
- Synthetic stock, fully bedded, painted w/ Zebra pattern and recoil pad.
- -Two sling swivel studs.
- Leupold scope base & rings.
- Leupold VXII Ultra-light 3x9 scope.



 Satin matte finish on all steel. Wilderness sling.

The Yost-Bonitz shop worked very closely with Ted Nugent in order to produce a rifle that would be both classic and true to Nugent's individual style. On a recent trip to the Phoenix area Ted Nugent paid a visit to the Yost-Bonitz shop where he picked up his own copy of this rifle, an exact twin to the one being raffled.

The pistol is equally special. After the overwhelming response and success of LTW No.1 the craftsmen at LTW really pushed the envelope in an effort to top their own legacy. This time, the pistol work was preformed by John Harrison and Ned Christiansen, both men - masters of their craft - were able to complete his work on the gun without compromising each other's style.

The pistol started life as a bone-stock GI 1911A1 from Springfield Armory and first up to bat would be Ned Christiansen, with his work focusing on the bottom end of the gun. Since his beginnings in the custom-gun crafts Ned has become well known for thinking "out of the box" by developing what are truly unique methods for metal working that have culminated into never-before-seen metal. With the gun at his shop Ned preformed the following work:

Dehorn frame inside and out.

 Radius corners, de-burr and reduce knife-edge junctions inside the frame.

High cut front strap.

- Machine Conamyds on the front strap and main spring housing.

- Perform "girth reduction" on pistol

- "FLH" (Fairly Large Hole) mag-well treatment.

- Thin-out, fit, texture and bevel Duty Rated G10 stocks.

- Fit and blend CMC beavertail grip

 Fit STI S-7 tool steel sear, disconnect and CMC EDM tool steel hammer and set pull to four pounds.

- Fit and further lighten black anodized trigger with solid over-travel stop.

- Refit factory thumb safety, set detents and texture underside.

From there the gun moved on to John Harrison's shop. John is widely known among shooters for building true-toform classic 1911s and Browning Hi-Powers, ranging from basic carry conversions to full-blown, jaw-dropping classic beauties. Elegant and graceful, John's guns have won accolades for being as "clean" as they are functional, and the magic he worked on this pistol holds true to his previous accomplishments. With the gun at his shop John performed the following work:

Fit Kart match grade barrel and bushing.

- Fit Ed Brown "Hardcore" extractor.
- Fit EGW oversized firing pin stop.
- Flatten slide top.
- Fit Heinie Slant-Pro sights.
- Blend rear of slide and frame.
- Machine radius on lower corners of slide.
- Lower and flare ejection port.
- Machine ball cuts on front of slide.
- Fit EGW bolt-on plunger tube.
- Machine counter sink around the slide stop pinhole.
- Machine counter sink around magazine catch.
- Carry bevel entire gun.

The Other Goodies

What fun is a gun like this if you don't have anything to carry it in? For that task the men at LTW enlisted the help of Josh Bulman of Bulman Gunleather in Newry, Pennsylvania. Josh is a true artist in leather who has been working with leather in some form or another since the age of 10. His prowess behind a stitching machine is evident in every piece he sews.

For this project Josh selected his rendition of the traditional "pancake" holster design to be complemented by a double mag carrier and flashlight carrier. The holster is Josh's FBS-H (full belt slide-high) and the design of the rig is such that the pistol is carried higher than traditional belt slides while still offering good balance of the weapon and a high level of concealability. Josh modified his own mold by milling ball cuts into the front of the slide in order to precisely mold the holster to the exact dimensions of the pistol it will carry. Now that's attention to detail!

The magazine carrier provided is the QDMP (quick double magazine pouch) and the corresponding flashlight pouch is Josh's QLC (quick light case). The QDMP is designed to carry two magazines and both it and the QLC attach to the belt via one-way snap loops. Josh really set this leather package apart by crafting all of the carry gear from genuine

shell cordovan that is finished in a lovely whiskey color and accented by black sharkskin trim.

To help complete the package Strider Knives Inc., donated one of their fantastic blades during a brief encounter at SHOT Show between Mick Strider and Ted Yost and Steve Bailey of LTW. After hearing the ideas and goals behind LTW Mick sounded off with a resounding "I'm in, what can I do?" and promptly handed over a new Strider SMF folder. Once described as the "Hummer of knives" Strider Knives have a well-earned reputation worldwide as true "hard-use" knives.
